Report on the Susquehanna Annual Conference 2018

August 26, 2018

The Susquehanna Annual Conference 2018 was held at the Hershey Convention Center from May 31st to June 2nd. The theme this year was **"Better Together... One with Christ."** The theme echoed in the words of Christ from within John 17: "Make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world."

This was my first-ever trip to Annual Conference, and I was awe-inspired to say the least! A truly amazing feeling comes over you (and fills you) as you stand in a room filled with hundreds of believers who hold hands, sing in unity, praise the Savior and worship as one. It could only be the spirit of our Lord! Bishop Park opened the Conference with a reminder of the mission to **"Grow! Equip! and Connect!"** We are tasked to: **GROW** spiritual transformational leaders, **EQUIP** vital congregations and create new places for new people, and **CONNECT** with each other and the world! In his words he explained that: "our vision-alive in Christ together, the Susquehanna Conference will embody the beloved community of disciple-making congregations."

Kay Kotan led a session on "Equipping Vital Congregations." She introduced the concept of the "Tinder Box." A box that contains the tools for our church to grow: consultation, coaching, small group resources and curricula, workshops and new places for new people. Kay described each tool and showed where to find more information on the internet. The purpose of the "Tinder Box" is to help start the FIRE!

Several other sessions and workshops were held during the conference. Plenary sessions were held to conduct the business affairs of the Conference. Vendors, organizations and fundraisers filled the hallways of the Convention Center. New churches were opened and some churches were closed or moved. Retiring clergy were honored and new clergy were celebrated. Many songs were sung, prayers prayed and our Lord was worshipped.

The proposal from the Council of Bishops was discussed concerning "The Way Forward." The Council of Bishops is proposing "the One Church Plan" which allows churches to decide for themselves the contextualization of language about human sexuality in support of the mission. This plan will be voted on at the 2019 Susquehanna Annual Conference.

In closing, I wish to thank the 15th Street United Methodist Church for allowing me to represent them at Conference this year. It was an incredible experience that I will never forget. Rise Against Hunger

Twelfth Street United Methodist Church, along with First United Methodist Church and Donation United Methodist Church, are sponsoring a meal packaging event again with Rise Against Hunger. Rise Against Hunger, formerly Stop Hunger Now, is an international hunger relief non-profit organization that coordinates the packaging and distribution of food and other life-changing aid to people in developing nations.

The event will be held on a Sunday afternoon *next* October, 2019. All area churches will be asked to join and support this project. It takes approximately 2 hours for 40-50 people to fill 10,152 meal bags, each of which feeds 4-6 people. Each bag contains soy, a vitamin and mineral packet, dehydrated vegetables, and rice. The cost to sponsor a meal bag is \$.34. To do the required minimum amount of meal bags, it would cost \$3,451.68. The goal is to raise \$5,100.00 to fill 15,000 meal bags.

There is a kick off to raise funds with a chicken BBQ dinner on Wednesday, October 10th. Tickets are \$10.00 per meal. The dinner will include a half BBQ chicken, homemade baked beans, macaroni salad, applesauce, homemade brownie, and a roll with butter.

SMALL GROUP OPPORTUNITY: THE PURPOSE DRIVEN LIFE

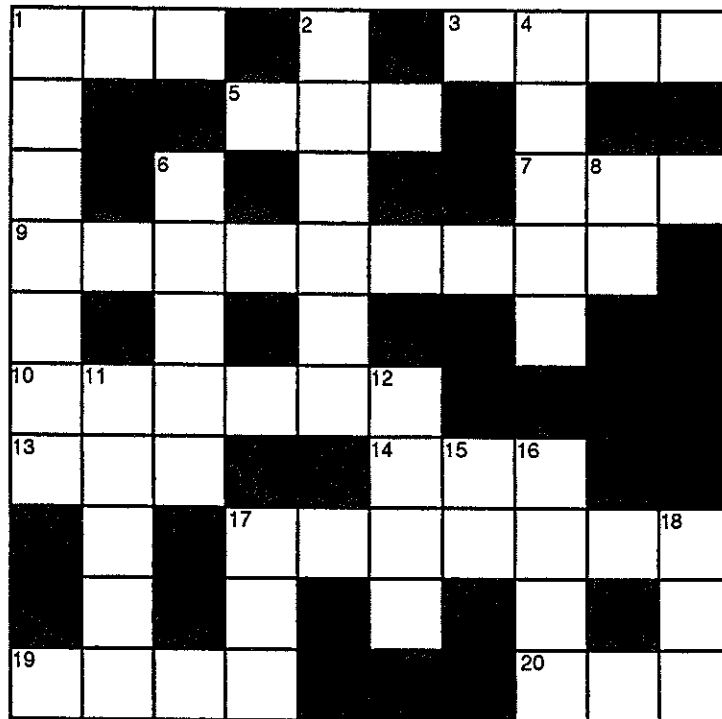
